Marian Hirsch is a full time professional artist. She is an accomplished artist moving seamlessly between multiple mediums – oil, pastel, watercolor and gouache. Her plein air studies provide the foundation for her color rich pastel landscapes, which are composed and created in her studio. Oil is her medium of choice for plein air work as it offers a more flexible approach. The field sketches allow her to come home with a record of a specific time and place and to capture the nuances of color that photos do not. Rich, juicy paint, quality over passages of transparent underpainting are characteristics of her work. Through the plein air works are small; she often works in considerable larger sizes. A recent commission was 4 by 6 feet.

Her artwork is included in numerous corporate collections such as Ford Motor Company, AT&T, Mary Kay Cosmetics, Merrill Lynch, Lucent Technologies, Cap Gemini Ernst & Young, Dallas Business Journal and Verizon Wireless. Articles about her paintings have been published in Artist's Magazine, American Artist, International Artist Magazine and the Pastel Journal. She is included in the book 200 Great Painting Ideas for Artist by North Light Books. She is a signature member of Pastel Society of America, Pastel Society of the Southwest, Southwestern Watercolor Society, Texas & Neighbors and Associated Creative Artists.
